FUEL UP NEWS SUMMER GAP PROGRAM- Fuel Up at Perry Harrison School is ending the school year with 54 participating students, 20 of whom (so far) want to participate in our "Summer Gap" program. This means we will need some assistance as we head into summer, and we're hoping we can count on your continued support. The "Summer Gap" program offers the opportunity for children served by Fuel Up to continue to receive supplemental food throughout the summer. It can be a particularly vulnerable time for children who are food insecure, and likely rely on the Federally-Funded Breakfast and Lunch Program during the school year. These meals are not available when school is out for the summer. Fuel Up has used special grant funds to purchase fresh fruits and perishables to add to these bags, which get picked up by the participants' caregivers (similar to our winter and Spring Break Bag Projects). **To learn more about how you can help please see this week's Mission News in our weekly email or go to www.fuelupkids.org.**
