and we shall feast with all your saints
in the joy of your eternal realm.

DONATIONS NEEDED

CORA needs specific items for The SNACK! Program (Summer Nutritional Assistance for Chatham Kids). In Chatham County 50% of public school children receive free or low-cost meals through the federal school lunch program because their household income is at or near the poverty level. More than 4,300 school children in Chatham County will not have adequate replacements for these meals during the summer. SNACK!'s goal is to increase the accessibility of nutritious meals throughout the summer to children facing food insecurity in Chatham County. SNACK! provides each participating child with 21 nutritious meals each week mid-June through mid-August. To learn more about The SNACK!
