Daniel's Story

"My first goal as the "assistant minister of music" is to help create a space for worship.

The pandemic presented challenges to our worship services. With the **mission of reaching out, we learned to offer a variety of different worship experiences.** We experimented with pre-recorded services, parking lot services via AM radio, live-streamed services, and outdoor worship in the beauty of the pines.

The beautiful result of this work, that I think will continue to be a gift to our congregation, is the addition of the outdoor service and the live-streamed/recorded service.

Perhaps more importantly, we have learned to approach our roles as worship leaders with more creativity and humility."

Joelle's Story

To help our young disciples stay connected during the pandemic, we offered a familyfriendly outdoor worship service for several months, at-home activity kits aligned with worship Bible readings, and weekly Zoom youth groups for 10–18-year-olds.

CITP **launched a new "tween" youth group** for 4th and 5th graders aimed at developing community, fun, and fellowship.

Our Sacred Art table went "wild" as worship services moved outdoors. Children create chalk drawing offerings during the early service that are enjoyed by many throughout the week.



Nana's Story

Approximately 12-14% of the Chatham County population lives at or below the poverty level (\$24,600/year for a family of 4).

Since January 1, 2021, donations to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund allowed CITP to pledge \$28,592.76 to help 56 families stay in their homes (eviction and foreclosure), keep utilities (water, gas, electric) connected, and provide temporary housing for individuals/families facing homelessness. We also provided financial support to three 501c3 agencies – Benevolence Farm, Hispanic Liaison and Chatham County NC Homeless Shelters' (also known as "Love Chatham").
