Dear Earth Care Congregation,

First, let me say thank you for your patience as you've waited for news of your certification. I have finished processing your applications, all 331 of them! I wanted to let you know that you have been certified as an Earth Care Congregation for 2024. It's been amazing to read about all the ways in which Presbyterians are being good stewards of creation. I welcome hearing from you during this coming year.

As an Earth Care Congregation, you may use the Earth Care Congregations seal to promote your commitment to earth care on your website, the church newsletter, t-shirts, etc., until the date that the certification expires. You will need to recertify in 2024. I've attached a few versions of the Earth Care Congregation logos to this email should you need them for any announcements, websites or special printings. You may not be able to open the attached .eps version but will be helpful if you are having banners or either items made requiring a high resolution image.

An adaptable press release has been attached here for your church to send to local media if you would like to publicize your Earth Care Congregation certification. Your church can fill in specific information as highlighted or add your own quotes and congregation examples before sending it to local media.

We will be updating the Earth Care Congregations listing and map that can be found online at <u>www.pcusa.org/earthcarecongregations</u> by the end of the month. I will be emailing your Presbytery later today with the news as well. You can expect to hear from me via email 6 or 7 times throughout the year with updates and reminders but if you have any further questions or concerns please don't hesitate to contact me at any time.

In 2024 we will again only be sending virtual notifications and certificates. This email will be followed by a second one in the coming weeks from my colleague Jenny Oldham that will have the attachment with your certificate for 2024. If you haven't received this email early April please let me know and we will follow up. We do intend to have these to you in time for Earth Day.




BLESSING OF The Animals




Here are a few things to know beforehand:


