
### STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN IS AT 90% OF GOAL

**NEW!** CITP has completed our third year of collecting winter clothing for those less fortunate - and once again you folks were amazing as this was not a burden on just several people - 12+ folks were involved in the collection and distribution process.

CITP collected 338 total items, of which were 101 adult and children's coats. (Special note, Debbie Sears donated more than 50 Childrens handmade scarves, hats, blankets that for those of us that saw them they were magnificent! She is amazing indeed! )

The program in total has collected more than 3,200 items of which

730 were coats. There were two distributions (Pittsboro and Siler City) with another one scheduled for December 9 at the Chatham Community Library.








We hope you will be able to worship with us Christmas Eve at our 4pm and/or 7pm services. Nursery care will be available at both services.

#### Pastor's Musing

#### Finally, Comes the Poet

I'm thankful for geese. Yes, they blare like alarms on a Saturday morning; yes, they leave their droppings like squishy landmines; yes, they are much grumpier than their petite cousins, the ducks.

Geese in the air, however, are another

matter. The flying V has inspired countless hearts, as well as two of our finest poets: <u>Wendell Berry</u> and <u>Mary</u> <u>Oliver</u>.

I recently discovered the work of Nuala Ní Dhomhnaill, a poet who writes exclusively in Irish. Through the work of a translator, I treasure yet another poem about geese, <u>"Winter Beachhead."</u> The poem takes place during "the starkest hour of the shore," possibly at dawn, when the sand is peaceful and clear. Geese in flight suddenly disrupt the tranquility as they "sail in their glory." By contrast, we humans "have to bide our time and hold out for the fullness to come."

I wish you a happy Thanksgiving. May you treasure the blessing of the beauty, no matter where you find it.

And I look forward to this Sunday and the start of Advent when our church gathers in faith and hope "for the fullness to come."


