Pastor's Musing

The Deep Notes

I attended a cello recital the other night as youth performed selections by Johann Sebastian Bach, the eminent German musician and composer whose last name is pronounced with a hock—Baccchh! He also fathered 20 children – good Lorrrdd!

All of the students played beautifully that evening. I love the deep notes of the cello. In addition, the diverse ages and ethnicities of the students served as a reminder of the unifying power of music, a grounding note in these discordant and divided times.

However, what most moved me were the quiet moments after the performance, when the student returned to a parent or grandparent who, with a beaming smile or a hug, welcomed the youth back to the seat. It's a beautiful thing when we lose ourselves —whether to music or love—and find connection, perhaps beyond words, to someone else.

Regarding Bach, he was compelled to compose music to provide for his enormous family. I'm sure that one cello and lessons for just one child are expensive, and schlepping that student to the studio requires a significant investment of time and energy. Also, I picture the parent at home enduring countless renditions and mistakes of the same piece as their budding cellist practices. The Germans have a way with words, and das Sitzfleisch (literally "sit flesh") refers to one's ability to sit through a long and tedious activity with patience.

Yet, from the looks of pride and love as their child performed, something priceless had stirred deep within.
