



# PASTOR'S MUSING

**Finally, Comes the Poet** 

#### April 3, 2025

My family is back from a spring break trip to New York City, where we ate giant slices of pizza, gawked at skyscrapers, and stood in awe of the dizzying lights. The Big Apple is bright, fast, and loud.

However, there were a few quiet and contemplative moments. Outside a Korean Presbyterian Church near Wall Street and the financial district was this statue of Jesus. He resembled many of the people living in the streets save for the mark of the cross in his hand. It was a poignant reminder as Good Friday approaches. In many ways, Easter is the Big Apple of the church year. Yet, we get there by traveling through Lent – the side streets and back alleys of faith where we reflect on the realities of pain, suffering, and death.

Joy Harjo, US Poet Laureate, claims, "We all have a part in shifting the story." I was encouraged by the church's witness in the City. There were huge steeples atop stone buildings, but more significantly, there were community meals, clothing drives, and warming shelters. If Matthew 25 is to be believed, these quiet graces of faith may lead to an encounter with the living Christ.
