CAN YOU HELP?



Sign-up to bring supplies.
Assemble Kits on May 18th.

We are making Church World Service kits again this year to help people in need – especially after a disaster.

Please help by signing-up in the narthex to bring items OR contact Susie Smith snyncks@gmail.com to indicate what items you will be bringing and the quantity. (We do not want 100 combs and only10 nail clippers.) This year our goal is to make at least 125 hygiene kits plus TWO clean-up buckets (supplies for after a hurricane) -- so we need 125 combs, 125 nail clippers, etc. CLICK HERE FOR THE BUCKET LIST; CLICK HERE FOR THE HYGIENE KIT ITEMS, they are also below.

Purchase items and bring them to the church by Sunday morning, May 18.

We will assemble the items between services on May 18 (final pack on the 25th).

For each Clean-Up Bucket we need:

- One five-gallon bucket with resealable lid (If reused, please scrub clean. Do not use a
 bucket that has held chemicals of any kind. Brand labels on the outside are acceptable.)
- Five scouring pads (No stainless steel or pads with soap in them. Remove from packaging.)
- · Seven sponges, including one large
- One scrub brush (With or without handle.)
- 18 reusable, lightweight multipurpose cleaning towels (Not paper towels. Remove from packaging. Here is an example: Amazon.com. JEBBLAS Disposable Cleaning Towels Dish Towels and Dish Cloths Reusable Towels, Handy Cleaning Wipes, 50 Count/Pack Blue: Health & Household)
- One 16-34oz bottle of liquid dish soap (antibacterial preferred)
- One 12-40oz bottle of liquid concentrate household cleaner that can be mixed with water (No spray bottles.)
- One 50-100ft clothesline (Cotton or plastic line.)
- Five dust masks (N95 particulate respirator dust masks preferred; No surgical masks.)
- Two pairs of heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (Latex-free preferred. Durable for multiple use. Remove from packaging.)
- One pair of heavy-duty, reusable work gloves (Such as nitrile, cotton with leather palm, or all leather.)
- 20-28 heavy-duty or contractor-type 30-45 gallon trash bags on a roll (Remove from packaging.)

All cleaning items must be new and all liquid items must be capped and securely tightened. Place all items into the bucket, making sure they are packed securely to avoid damage during shipment. Snap the lid on tight and seal with packing tape. Please do not enclose cash or checks inside of the kits or the boxes.

For each CWS Hygiene Kit we need:

- Washcloth
- Toothbrush (in original packing)
- Fingernail or toenail clipper (packaging removed)
- Bath-size bar of soap (in original packaging)
- Travel-size deodorant (3.4 oz. or less, non-aerosol)
- Travel-size lotion (3.4 oz. or less, fragrance-free, NEW only)
- Travel-size shampoo (3.4 oz. or less, NEW only)
- Travel-size toothpaste (3.4 oz. or less, expiration date of 1 year)

 Sturdy wide-tooth comb (6" minimum teeth, packaging removed)








Spring Poetry Forum

During the months of July and August, we will have Combined Worship at 10am indoors, which means no outdoor worship at 9:15am.


We hope all of our 9:15 and 11am worshippers will join this 10am summer worship, and that we can embrace the opportunity to worship and share fellowship with each other during this time.

Finally, Comes the Poet

A Longing to Belong: A Homily at Galloway Ridge Acts 9:36–43

The acclaimed, brilliant, tortured, and tragic genius writer David Foster Wallace once remarked, "I don't believe in God, but I miss Him." This sentiment seems to

me to mark the current context for many people in America today.

On the one hand, Americans have turned away from the church and organized religion. Some of this is due to scientific advancements and human rights, which some Christians have wrongly taken positions against. Indeed, we Christians have often been the worst ambassadors of the faith; survey after survey has shown that the number one reason that people have left the religion is because of the hypocrisy of pastors and people in the pews. Lord, have mercy upon us.

Hypocrisy is nothing new. Yet, in the past few decades, there has been a shift in public attitudes here in our country. People are not flocking back to the church, even in denominations like the Southern Baptists, which at one point enjoyed the highest membership totals. But at the same time, the so-called New Atheists have lost ground. It is no longer popular to say, "God is dead." As Lauren Jackson put it in this Sunday's *New York Times*, "the power of belonging" is a real need, and people seem more open to the idea that such belonging might be found within institutions of religion.

What, then, should be our response as people of faith? Personally, I am tired of the arguments for the existence of God, namely, because I am weary of arguing. There is enough that divides us. What can we share? What shared understanding can we wrap our arms around, if not fully embrace?

It is through this lens that I read this passage in Acts. Indeed, Peter demonstrated the power of God. But before the apostle was on the scene, there was Tabitha, a woman of faith in action: "She was devoted

to good works and acts of charity" (Acts 9:36). Tabitha was so beloved that, when Peter arrived, "all the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them" (Acts 9:39). No, she hadn't changed names! The Aramaic "Tabitha" is translated to "Dorcas" in Greek. This translation in the text shows that she was a Jew, a member of an established religion, who was known in the larger, Gentile population not for her statements of faith but for her acts of love. She was remembered and mourned for her kindness to those in need, acts of generosity that were as apparent as the articles of clothing that she gave.

Peter raised her from the dead, and "many believed in the Lord" (Acts 9:42). The power of God was made manifest, and we can pray for signs and wonders in our day and time.

But those people wouldn't have mourned Tabitha/Dorcas if not for her kindnesses.

People remembered her not for her arguments, but for her faith in action.

May we embody the same qualities. May we be known as a kind, generous, welcoming, inclusive, and faithful people in a time when more and more individuals are longing for a sense of belonging in their lives. May we do the work that matters—feeding, clothing, housing, caring for the sick and for children—and not waste time and effort with silly arguments. May we remember that our work is about resurrections in this life—raising our hands and minds to help and so lifting up our hearts to God.
