

Addressing Andrew and Amber, the parents of the child receiving the sacrament of baptism, you present your daughter, Daisy, before God and this congregation. As God embraces you within the covenant, I ask you to profess your faith in, hope for, and love of the Triune God:

Trusting in the gracious mercy of Abba, Father, do you turn from the ways of sin and renounce the power of evil in the world?

Do you turn to Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior, trusting in his grace and love?

Will you be Christ’s faithful disciple as guided in the truth by the Holy Spirit?

And do you promise to lead your child, Daisy, by prayer, instruction, and example until that time

when she can by grace confirm her faith?

And to the congregation of witnesses, on behalf of the church universal, do we pray for this family as a reflection of the grace of God in the world today? **We do.**

Let us pray:

For you, little child,
Jesus Christ has come, he has fought, he has suffered.
For you he entered the shadow of Gethsemane and the horror of Calvary.
For you he uttered the cry, “It is finished!”
For you he rose from the dead
and ascended into heaven
and there he intercedes —
for you, little child, even though you do not know it.
But in this way the word of the Gospel becomes true.
