






The Salvation Army has the opportunity to partner with the Army National Guard in Siler City to host a summer fundraising event/fun day Saturday, July 19, and you are invited!

PASTOR'S MUSING



Finally, Comes the Poet

Pádraig Ó Tuama, an Irish poet and theologian, notes that "prayer," in English, comes from the French *prier*, which is "to ask." Sometimes we know what we want, and we have the courage to ask for it. At least for me, there are other times when my prayers ring flat and have little energy. The old words seem dry and brittle. There's no use in feeling ashamed: without the ebb, there would be no flow.

Ó Tuama ends his prayers by offering "a little bird of praise," an image that I love. Around the church, there are plenty of songbirds, chirping and crooning. I'm told that many of these calls are territorial, more like frustrated neighbors shouting over the fence posts than praise. That may be so. And yet I think of these songs when trying to give a little lift to my prayers.

Lili Taylor, an actor and author of Turning to Birds, notes, "The difference between the sense of hearing and the skill of listening is attention." While she claims she neither believes in heaven nor God, her observation about attention is insightful about prayer. So, I begin by hearing the birds, then I really try to listen. And I begin by asking God, then I really try to give my attention to the prayer. But if, for whatever reason, I'm still distracted or confused or bored or whatever, there are always the birds.
