


The group has begun reading Jill Duffield's book, *Appreciate These Things*. Please know you are invited to join the group for fellowship and wonderful discussions.

Finally, Comes the Poet

#23 and Forever

I grew up in Raleigh as an Atlanta Braves fan due to the influence of my maternal grandfather, yet I also followed the Chicago Cubs on WGN. Wrigley Field had the iconic ivy-covered brick walls, announcer Harry Caray in Coke-bottle eyeglasses singing during the seventh-inning stretch, and second baseman Ryne Sandberg. This #23 was not as famous as his counterpart on the basketball court. He was neither as intimidating as his teammate Andrew "The Hawk" Dawson nor as smooth as the aptly named first baseman, Mark Grace. But neither flashy nor cocky, Sandberg was the face of the Cubs.

As a hitter, "Ryno" dug in close to the plate, daring the pitcher to throw inside. His compact swing and lightning-fast hands could pull almost any pitch. In the field, he ranged left and right to gobble up ground balls and had a strong, accurate throwing arm. His unassuming physique gave hope to a skinny kid (like me) that maybe he could play, too. I emulated his batting stance and how he spat into the pocket of his glove.

He played on some terrible teams and never made it to a World Series. In today's game, he'd likely have been traded to a contender or signed an astronomical free-agent contract with one of the better teams. But Sandberg stayed in Chicago.

Like famous American poets Whitman and Frost, Donald Hall understood a timeless aspect of this sport: "It is by baseball that our memories bronze themselves. By baseball, we join hands with the long line of forefathers and with the dead." Ryne Sandberg died on Monday, but I can picture #23 still in his uniform, spitting into his glove or digging into the batter's box.
