





QUESTION What advice do you have for college freshmen?

Dear Pastor,

What advice do you have for college freshmen? Higher Education

Dear Higher Education,

When I was a freshman, I received my first email address. There were also dinosaurs roaming the grounds.

But with that caveat in mind, my advice is to attend the student activity fair. It's the event that brings all the various clubs and extracurriculars together.

First, there is always free food. You can't go wrong there. Second, it

provides opportunities to try new things.

A buddy of mine had never rowed before, but he happened to check out the crew team during his first week on campus. Not only did he participate for the next four years, but he also made lifelong friendships. Even if his experience is rare, I bet that most freshmen will discover some group that interests them. Be open-minded.

Campus ministries are often at these types of events. Again, accept all free food, but don't necessarily be persuaded by the largest or flashiest ministries. If something doesn't feel right, then trust your instincts and, like Jesus said, shake the dust off your sandals, boots, or Nike Air Force 1s.

Ginny was the Presbyterian campus minister for years, and her group was always on the smaller side. Her students, however, were incredible and, just as importantly, incredibly supportive of one another. Many of them have remained friends after graduation.

In addition to that email address, I was introduced to several people that first week of college who I have kept in touch with since, even without the benefit of social media. Wes taught me to play guitar, and occasionally when I am feeling overwhelmed, I pluck the notes of the first song he taught me to play, "Wish You Were Here" by Pink Floyd. Wes is a pastor, too, but 25 years ago, we found each other as "two lost souls swimming in a fishbowl." It still makes me smile.

Finally, I'll say that my advice for college freshmen is essentially the same for someone at any stage of life, particularly a transition—what does your heart treasure? Therein lies what you need to know.
