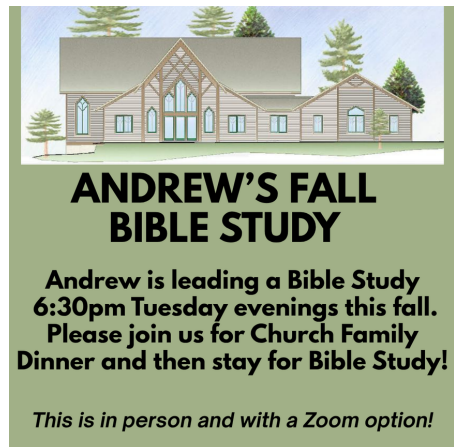
FAITH FORMATION & YOUTH GROUP:
