



How do you respond to folks asking for help on the side of the road?

Signed, Wanting to be a Good Samaritan

This is the latest installment of the new "Ask a Pastor" series. Leave your written questions in the box labeled in the narthex.

Dear Pastor,

How do you respond to folks asking for help on the side of the road?

Wanting to Be a Good Samaritan

Dear Good Samaritan,

You have asked a question that, I believe, is on the hearts and minds of many people, whether Christian or not. But since you are a person of faith, I will first say that you can pray not only for the person outside your car but also by looking into your heart. Ask God what you are called to do.

If you are stopped at a traffic light or intersection, you can greet the

person, say your first name, and then ask for theirs. Such a salutation gives a sense of dignity. I've had folks tell me that I was the only person who bothered to introduce myself. Sharing a name is a way of saying that you care.

I carry bottles of water and granola bars in my car so that I can offer these essential items. Typically, I do not give money. I do tell folks about the church and how we have funds available to help. These funds are paid only to creditors, such as Duke Power or a landlord, and never to individuals. If you would like to make a financial contribution to this discretionary fund, rest assured that 100 percent is given on behalf of those in need.

In that moment, when you are with an unhoused or unsheltered person, you can always introduce yourself and ask for their name. It's possible that you will see that person again, and you can reintroduce yourself. Most likely, you will be remembered; as I've said, it's rare that people stop and give dignity. Over the years, I've known several folks who regularly stand by the side of the road near my house. I've gotten to know one gentleman well enough that he asks me for prayers. I don't have a desire to "toot my horn," but rather hope that you, too, will try and make such a difference in someone's life.


