These meals will be distributed in Pittsboro on Tuesday, December 2 from 4:30 to 6:00, at St. Bart's. Any leftovers will go out to Siler City on the following Friday.

Each package was a full 12 ounces of well-seasoned meat which will be the foundation for dinner in a family that really appreciates a hand in these difficult times. With all of the disruption of food support programs, and the hard economic times in general, the work of the volunteers fills a great need in our community.





This season we collected: 228 items total here at CITP!



This is the latest installment of the new "Ask a Pastor" series. Leave your written questions in the box labeled in the narthex.

Dear Pastor,

What is your favorite book of the Bible and why?

Well, friend, I'm going to cheat a little and give a couple of answers. Luke is my favorite gospel because of the parables of the Good Samaritan and Prodigal Son (Luke 10:25–37; 15:11–32), and my favorite epistle is Philippians because of "the peace that surpasses all understanding that guards your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:7). I think the stories found in Genesis are endlessly fascinating, and I love the poetry of Psalms.

However, if pressed to pick just one, I'd choose the Book of Jonah. I think Jonah is the only book that is actually a comedy.

There is slapstick, namely the big fish that vomits the prophet on dry land. Furthermore, when God calls the prophet to Nineveh, he sets off in the exact opposite direction!

But the holy humor is actually more subtle; it's about overturning expectations. When Jonah is on the ship in the middle of the storm, it is the pagan sailors, presumably polytheistic, who act with fear and reverence toward the Most High God and not the prophet of the Lord asleep below deck.

When Jonah, dripping in fish puke, finally arrives in Nineveh, he preaches the worst sermon ever—only one line and without any promise of deliverance: "Forty more days and Nineveh will be overthrown." And for his half-hearted and lackluster effort, Jonah is unquestionably the most successful prophet in Hebrew history! He caused the entire city to repent in sackcloth and ashes, from the king all the way down to the livestock!

Rather than celebrating God's mercy, Jonah sulks on a hill outside the city. God causes a little plant to grow and shade the prophet, but when a worm eats the plant, Jonah is so upset that he wants to die. The book ends with God asking Jonah a question: "You have been concerned about this plant, though you did not tend it or make it grow. It sprang up overnight and died overnight. And should I not have concern for the great city of Nineveh, in which there are more than a hundred and twenty thousand people who cannot tell their right hand from their left —and also many animals?"

While there is much to love in the Bible, this book cleverly questions our propensity for self-righteous justification while embracing the mercy of the Lord with utmost seriousness.
