




**NURSERY UPDATE!!!**




# **Church Directory**

## Glossary for Lent

**Lent:** refers to the 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday (excluding Sundays). The word is derived from Old English *lencten* for “spring.” It also evokes the “lengthening” of days in the Northern Hemisphere as it moves toward the summer solstice.

**Shrove:** from the Old English *striven* that meant “to confess” and receive forgiveness. Note the similarity to the word “strive.” Shrove Tuesday is the day before Ash Wednesday. The tradition of pancakes for supper is derived from the effort to use any surplus eggs, milk, and butter prior to giving up those foods for the fast in Lent.

**Mardi Gras:** literally “Fat Tuesday” in French, referring to the last day before the fast in Lent from consuming rich, fatty foods, including red meat. Same date as Shrove Tuesday.

**Ash Wednesday:** marks the beginning of Lent with a service for confession of sins, usually based on Psalm 51. The ashes refer to those placed on the forehead or back of hand in the sign of a cross that remind the worshipper of their mortality: “You are made of dust, and to dust you shall return” (Genesis 3:19).

**Fasting:** not “quick, swift” but from Old English for “abstain,” usually from food. The root meaning is “to hold” or keep in place (think “to fasten”) and refers to self-discipline of “holding back” from something, traditionally food, drink, or sex.

**Holy Week:** the week between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday, which remembers the last week of Jesus’ life and his resurrection.

**Passover:** the tenth and final plague against the Egyptians. The Lord caused the death of every firstborn in the land, whether human or livestock, unless the blood of a sacrificed lamb was spread on the door of the home, which meant that the angel of death would “pass over” that house and spare the lives within (see Exodus 12). The word Pascha” is the Aramaic transliteration of Passover and is often used by Christians in reference to Easter. “Paschal lamb” is used in reference to Christ.

**Seder:** a ritualized dinner in Judaism in remembrance of the Passover in which certain foods are eaten to symbolize the Passover story and teach the Exodus to children and children at heart: “You shall tell your child on that day, saying, ‘It is because of what the Lord did for me when I came out of Egypt.’” (Exodus 13:8). The word itself is from the Hebrew for “order” or “sequence” because the meal chronicles the Passover story.

**Paschal Triduum:** from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. It is also referred to as the Easter Triduum.

**Maundy Thursday:** from the Latin for “commandment” (think “mandate”), which refers to the new commandment that Jesus gave to love one another (John 13:34).

Also, the date of the **Last Supper** (see below).

**Words of Institution:** the words said by Christ at the Passover meal before he was arrested and crucified, which for those reasons became known as the Last Supper. These words are said to consecrate Communion: “The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, ‘This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me.’ In the same way, after

supper he took the cup, saying, ‘This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me.’ For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord’s death until he comes.” (1 Corinthians 11:23–26).

**Good Friday:** the day of the crucifixion and death of Jesus. The day is “good” only in hindsight: “The Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the teachers of the law, and he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life.” (Luke 9:22).

**Tenebrae:** Latin for “darkness,” the term can refer to services at night during Holy Week, though it is used especially for Good Friday. The worship often includes the extinguishing of candles and exiting the sanctuary in silence.

**Harrowing of Hell:** refers to the time between the death and resurrection of Jesus in which he “descended to the lower earthly regions” (Ephesians 4:9). Once there, Christ “preached good news to the dead” (1 Peter 4:6). “Harrowing” is an agricultural term that refers to a tool with teeth or tines that is dragged over plowed ground to break up clods of dirt. The spiritual idea is that Christ triumphed over death in order to free souls. “Hell” does not refer to a place of torment but rather to the underworld, or Sheol, in the Old Testament, where the souls of the dead went to sleep.

**Easter:** Christian celebration of the resurrection of Christ. The date is based on calculating the first Sunday after the first full moon on or after the vernal equinox. The term is likely derived from the name of an Anglo-Saxon goddess whose festival was in the spring.
